News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

Year N: This week in Cherry class we have been learning all about homes. Through the book 'All kinds of Homes', we have explored different types of houses people can live in and features of these homes that are similar and different to our own homes. This has been linked into our classroom provision with building homes using construction materials and using printing tools to create a picture of our own home. We have also continued our learning on instrumental sounds, creating our own noise makers and exploring using instruments to change and adapt sounds. In maths, we have been continuing to explore sorting in different ways. Next week we will be exploring our feelings through the story 'The Colour Monster'. We will be learning to identify and name our feelings through colours. We will also be creating our own colour monsters using coloured playdough and loose parts. We will be exploring colour mixing in the creative area! Please can I also remind you that our Year N Express Event will be taking place on Tuesday 10 th at 2pm.	Year R This week within Oak Class we have been developing our comparative skills within our Maths learning, looking at colour, size and weight. Using the vocabulary of different, heavy and light. Within our topic learning this week the children have been looking at how we can be a good friend, identifying emotions and things we can do to be kind to others. Next week will be our Express event held on 11 th October at 2pm. It would be fantastic to see as many of our parents and carers attend to see just how amazing your little ones are doing within their learning. But please don't worry if you can't as we will have many other opportunities throughout the year. A huge well done to our little Oaks this week who were fantastic at bringing in their reading books! We can really tell that your little ones are engaging with reading at home. Thank you so much to our fantastic parents and carers for supporting them. Our little Oaks would also like to send a huge thank you to our amazing Office Coordinator, Mrs Urquhart, who made some wonderful sound log slices for the children to explore and make words.
Year 1: Five wonderful weeks have flown by for us all in Willow Class! We've been striving for amazing things, beginning our new story, 'The Lion Inside', in our Literacy, exploring feelings and the concept of empathy through drama. Next week, we will be beginning our work on our diary entry outcome, writing entries as Mouse and wanting to roar that little bit louder for the other animals! In Maths, we'll be beginning addition and multiplication, exploring a multitude of challenging problems relating to addition and subtraction, as well as continuing to explore the number line. In our wider curriculum in Music, we'll be learning Cauliflowers Fluffy, all ready for our Harvest celebrations, as well as continuing to delve into how we can appreciate the past in our History learning. Finally, in PSHRE, we'll continue to explore how we can value one another, be ourselves and the idea of rewards and responsibilities. Please can I also remind you that our Year 1 Express Event will be taking place on Thursday 12 th October at 2pm in the school hall.	Year 2: This week in English we have been immersing ourselves in our story 'The Town and Country Mouse'. We have been looking at the order of the events in the story and have been retelling it using a set number of sentences. In Maths we have moved on to subtraction and addition, where we have been looking at number bonds to 20 and learning about fact families. In Science we have been looking about the materials of playground toys in preparation for making our own toys next week. In history we have been learning more about our local area, exploring key features and the history of different places we may have visited. Please be reminded that next week it is our express event on Wednesday 11 th October morning at 9am. We look forward to seeing you there!

Year 3: Next week we are going to be carrying on learning addition and subtraction in maths. We will be focussing on column addition and subtraction. In Literacy, we are going to create a Stone Age bookmark and then write instructions to help others make one. In Science, we are going to be looking at soils and dirt - exploring what soil is made from. In History, we are going to be replicating Stone Age cave paintings. In art, we are going to continue learning about Jacob Lawrence and will have a go at replicating his artwork. Our Express Event is Friday 13 th October at 2pm - we look forward to seeing you all there!	Year 4: Next week in Literacy, we will be writing our informal letters based on the life of a Roman soldier. We will plan these carefully before writing them. In maths, we'll be looking at subtracting 4-digit numbers as well as estimating answers. Next week is very exciting, as we have our express event on Monday! The express event will start at 9am and finish at 10am. We will have some exciting activities all to do with our topic about the Romans. We will also have our literacy and maths books on the stage for you to look at all the amazing learning that we have done. We look forward to seeing you all there. Please can I also remind you that our Year 4 Express Event will be taking place on Monday 9 th October at 9:00am in the school hall.
Year 5: Next week in Year 5, we will continue reading ' <i>Treason</i> ' and be writing our own poems about King Henry VIII's wives. In maths we will be learning about multiples and factors. In science we will be learning about thermal insulators and conductors. In our history lesson, we will be learning about Francis Drake. Please be reminded that our PE day is Tuesday.	Year 6: This week in literacy we will be moving on from our work on informal letters and will be working towards writing a setting description on the concentration camp Bruno has seen through the curious window in his bedroom. At the beginning of the week, we will be identifying and generating descriptive and figurative language to support our
