Dear Parents, Carers, Children and Staff,

As we reach the end of this term, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our parents and carers for all of their kindness and support, to thank our amazing children for the incredible effort they have put into their learning this term and to our wonderful staff team who always give their very best to the children. It was wonderful to share the children's fantastic learning this week during visits from REAch2's Cluster 8 Deputy Headteachers and Headteachers this week! I especially would like to thank Mrs Coleman for going above and beyond in her cover of our reception desk! I would also like to thank Mrs Urquhart for also helping out across the school, with swimming, nursery and arranging whole school events. One parent kindly brought to our attention this week, that even if you might believe you have parental controls set on your child's internet access, this may only extend to one internet browser rather than all. Therefore, it is important to ensure you have parental controls set on all internet browsers – or set the restrictions on one and then delete the other internet browsing apps. It is also crucial that parents and carers check their child's mobile device regularly to monitor what content they have had access to and what they might be sharing with others. I would like to extend thanks to this parent for kindly giving up their time to share this with us and for offering advice to be shared with the whole school community.

As mentioned last week, we have introduced a simplified version of our school rules, to help our children better remember what these are:

#### 1) Be Kind 2) Be Respectful 3) Be Responsible

We shall continue to reflect on these rules with the children and consolidate them next term.

# News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

#### Year N:

This week in nursery we have been exploring what it means to be a Vet reading the story 'Mog and the Vet'. We created our own vets in the role play area this week, exploring different roles and looking at how we can help animals. We had a fantastic time bird watching on Wednesday! We prepared bird feeders earlier in the week and hung them from our tree in the garden. The children then built their own bird watching station using construction blocks to hide from the birds so that we didn't disturb them! We also added binoculars and books we found in the library to do with birds.

After half term we will be moving on to the topic 'On the Move'. The children will learn about physical journeys that they have made/will make, focusing again very much on their own first-hand experiences of travelling. This topic is specifically designed to look at journeys, and different ways children may have travelled, drawing on their own cultural capital. It then looks at travel to other countries and finishes with journeys to space. Our first story will be 'Naughty Bus!'

#### Year R

In our final week of this term, we have been learning about vets and pets. The children have really enjoyed this topic, particularly learning about how to look after a pet. This term's topic, of 'Everyday Superheroes', is now coming to an end. We have learned so much about medical staff, our bodies, animals and emergency services. Next term we will start a new topic called "On the Move". This topic will look at travelling and transportation. This should lead to some excellent opportunities for learning and exploring.

After half term, we will continue with our walks on a Tuesday, so please remember to send in wellies every Tuesday - or leave a pair in school.

#### Year 1:

It's been a busy final week of term in Willow class, we have been planned and written up our narratives using our book 'The Selfish Crocodile'. We wrote the sections carefully to make sure we had a clear beginning, middle and end. The class have worked hard to produce their final write. Well done Willows!

In Maths we finished our addition and subtraction work and have started our next place value unit that will be carried over to next term. The children have begun by counting back and forth between 0 and 50, recognising tens and finding the number 'before' and 'after'.

Willows also enjoyed The Big Bird Watch on Wednesday using pinecones covered in bird seed and hanging them on the trees in the playground. We went outside to spot how many birds it had attracted and made a note of the different breeds that were in the area too.

In music, Willows put their performance skills to the test. The children have been exploring the song 'I'm in the Groove' through different genres each week this term. They then picked their favourite version and sung it beautifully to the rest of the school in assembly. Brilliant!

Mrs Hardiman and Mrs Earney hope you have a wonderful, restful break after all the hard work that has been achieved this term.

#### Year 2:

I would like to begin by saying how proud I am of everyone in Maple Class this term! Your children have all worked so hard sitting all the test papers over the last two weeks, with an amazing boat building express event and ending with our super school trip to Chatham Dockyardaday enjoyed by all both children and staff.

In English we have been covering poetry this week and have written our own acrostic poems. We even performed them to the class and shared our meerkat facts all in the style of our working text: 'Meerkat Mail'. Next term in English we will be reading a book called: 'Gorilla' by Anthony Brown. We will be writing a character description of the Gorilla describing his features.

In Maths we have been telling the time to five past the hour. We have been able to use the terms 'minutes past' and 'minutes to' the hour. Next term we will be looking at multiplication and division focusing on the 2 times table.

Our topics for our afternoon lessons are as follows next term: In Science we will be learning about Plants considering their growth and what they need to grow. In DT we will be looking at wool and textiles. In Geography we will be learning about the continents and their temperatures. Finally in Computing we will be learning about Excel and the basic functions of this programme.

We hope you have a restful half term week.

#### Year 3:

I cannot believe we are at the end of Term 3, and halfway through this academic year! I would like to say a massive well done for the hard work and dedication that the children have put in this year.

Next term our topic is 'What's beneath our feet?' This topic focuses on volcanoes. We will be spending our geography lessons exploring the layers of Earth, its tectonic plates and how volcanoes are formed! In Literacy and Guided Reading, we will be reading 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. This is a lovely story about a young girl who dreams of being a Firework Maker. In maths, we are going to be starting with multiplication & division before moving on to fractions. In Science, our new topic is 'Parts of a Plant', exploring how plants grow best. In DT, we will be designing and creating our own photo frame and in RE, we will be answering the question: 'Where do Islamic beliefs come from?'

Please can children keep practising their times tables on TTRockstars and read something every day over the holiday. We really hope you have a lovely break and look forward to seeing you back on Monday  $19^{\rm th}$  February!

#### /ear 4:

Next term our working text will be 'Charlotte's Web' with the writing foci of setting description, diary entries and speech. In Mathematics, we shall cover fractions and the properties of shapes. Please can you encourage your child to continue practicing their timestables on TTRockstars! In Science we shall be investigating 'Animals including Humans'. Our Geography focus will be 'Spectacular Spain'.

#### Year 5

In science we are on our last week of human body changes and we are comparing with other forms of life, such as other mammals and plants. In History we are carrying on with Greek civilization, last week we learned about the origins of Olympic games and how much it has changed as we do have now the paralympic games and women can also take part and this week we learned about the origins of democracy and how it differs from today.

#### Year 6

Firstly, I would like to say a huge well done to all the children in Sycamore Class for another fantastic term of resilience & positivity. All the children have worked exceptionally hard and produced some outstanding work and test scores; we could not ask anymore of them!

Next term our topic is Blue Planet. We will be learning about the layers of the ocean, animal adaptions and pollution. Our literacy work will focus on our working text 'Clockwork' by Philip Pullman. We will begin the term with a diary entry before moving on to an explanation and a newspaper report. In science our topic will be 'Evolution and Inheritance'. We will start the term off by looking at our inherited and environmental characteristics. We will then move on to look at variation and adaptation.
