# News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

#### Year N:

What a great week it has been to welcome everyone back to Nursery and for our new children to start their journey with us! This week we have been settling back into routines and thinking about our rules and expectations in Cherry Class. We have been looking at the number one and exploring counting with cubes. We have also introduced the number one in Numberblocks. We have also given the children their own individual name card where they can practise writing their name to build up their confidence.

Next week we will be looking at the story 'Koala makes the right choice' where we will explore choices and consequences. We will also be exploring the weather in our play through looking at the properties of ice in the water tray, polar animals in the small world and creating our own winter playdough. We will also be forming the letters of out name in some gloop!

#### Year R

Welcome back to what has been a very wet and cold week! We have been busy this week learning about jobs people do, especially emergency services. We are very lucky that next week we should receive a visit from our local Police Officer; the children will no doubt enjoy this immensely. Our book for the week is 'Burglar Bill' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. We will be talking about fingerprints and crime scenes, which should be very exciting. In our Maths lessons we will be learning more about one more and

#### Year 1:

We have had an amazing first week back after Christmas. We have all shared our stories about what we did to celebrate.

We have been reading a new book in literacy, 'Zog and the flying Doctors'. We have been role playing the story and learning all about imperative verbs and writing instructions.

In Maths we have been looking at all of the numbers within 20. We have been recognising the written number and matching it to its numeral. We have also been learning about how to change the thickness of a paintbrush and change the colour on the paint programme for computing and learning all about Jesus and his disciples in RE.

#### Year 2:

I would like to begin by saying how amazing Maple class have been coming back to school after the holidays! We have had a fantastic week showing careful listening and trying our best with all our learning. We are very proud of all of the children.

This week in English we have a new working text for this term: 'Meerkat Mail' by Emily Garvett. We will be writing a diary entry at the end of next week describing each day of Sunny's journey.

In Maths we have been learning about money. We have been looking at both pounds and pence and have been counting coins using their value. We will continue learning about money next week adding and subtracting different amounts. In History we have learnt about Christopher Columbus. We wrote fact files this week and we will learn more facts and map his journey across the ocean next week. In Science we are looking at living things and their habitats. We began looking at how things change and will learn about the different habitats next week.

Please can we ask that you continue to send your children in with their reading folders each day. It is really important they come in so that we can listen to the children read. Thank you.

#### Year 3:

Next week, on Wednesday, we are heading up to London to see 'Matilda The Musical' - I know lots of the children are excited for this! In English, we will be planning, writing, editing and improving our diary entries, pretending that we are Barney from 'Stig of the Dump'. In maths, we are continuing to practice our times tables, particularly focusing on the 8 times table. In art we will continue our double page spreads about Gunta Stölzl and will explore how to weave using paper. In History, we will be making clay pots, similar to those that were made during the Stone Age.

Please note that our class Express Event is on Monday  $29^{th}$  January at 9am - we look forward to seeing you there.

#### Year 4:

A huge well done to the class for an amazing first week! Thank you so much to all of the children and Mrs Fletcher for making me feel so welcome.

Next week, in English we are continuing with our narrative, describing settings based on 'The Railway Children'. In Maths, we will continue learning about 'Time' – please speak with your child and ask them what they know about time. In Science, we will begin learning about Sound and in History we shall be learning about Anglo-Saxons in more detail

Please ensure your child brings their reading book and reading folder in every day and ensure your child practices their timestables each day. The children need to be able to recall these at speed. Spellings will be given out next Friday.

#### Year 5:

Well done year 5 for an outstanding start of the week! You have all settled in so well, ensuring that our new supply teacher has also felt welcome within our team!

Next week, on Wednesday, we will be heading up to London, to watch 'Matilda the Musical' with Year 3. We are incredibly excited about this! In addition to this, next week we will continue our new topic about ancient Greece. In science, we will be looking to further our knowledge on how our bodies work. In literacy, we will be using our research to finish our non-chronological reports about ancient Greece.

We look forward to another exciting week with you!

#### Year 6:

Firstly, I would like to say welcome back to school and to Term 3! I hope you all had a lovely Christmas break and enjoyed the New Year celebrations.

This term our topic is 'Hola Mexico'. We will be learning all about the Maya civilisation. Our class text this term is Holes by Louis Sachar. All our literacy learning will be focus on this text. Towards the end of term, we will be holding a special Mexican night where the children can experience a range of Mexican food and we will be watching the film version of Holes. Please can I ask that you sign your child up on Class Dojo if they would like to take part.

In science this term our topic is 'Living Things and their Habitats.' We will be learning all about Carl Linnaeus and his seven stages of classification. We will also be learning how to use a branching classification key and understanding what microorganisms are and why they are important.
