## News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

#### Year N:

This week in Nursery, we have been focusing on the book, 'The Lost Property Office'. The children have been really interested in this idea that lost things can end up there and were very happy to see the little girl get her teddy back in the story! We have been learning about using tools and techniques to create our own bear pictures such as painting with different sized brushes, stampers and even toothbrushes! We have also celebrated World Book Day focussing on 'Stick man oh stick man'. We have been collecting our own sticks to design our very own stickman and creating our own stickman story sacks.

Next week we will be looking at the story 'Zoey's First Plane Ride' and exploring taking a journey on a plane. We will look at how planes work as well as looking at maps of the world to see where we have already travelled and where we might like to travel to. We will also be creating our own passports and making planes with construction materials!

#### Year R

This week we have seen so much development in Oak class; the children are always so keen to learn and show great behaviour. We are very proud of them. We have started to really extend our writing in year R and the children are really rising to the challenge. We have very much enjoyed World Book Day in Oak class, with some wonderful learning around a variety of Julia Donaldson books. Next week, our story is 'Emma Jane's Aeroplane' by Katie Haworth and Daniel Rieley. This story takes us on a journey around the world, so please encourage your child to talk about the different countries we are learning about. In our Maths lessons next week, we will start looking at 3D shapes, such as cubes and spheres. Our topic learning will continue to focus on transport and journeys.

#### Year 1:

What a busy week it has been in Willow class! The children have been such fantastic learners and they have tried their hardest following the school rules and our values. Well done!

This week in Maths we have been looking at mass and weights and have been busy comparing the weights of objects using balancing beams. We have been using the words heavier and lighter to compare weights. We have started a new book Literacy called "A Walk in London". The children have had fun learning the fun facts about landmarks in London as they follow the little girl in the book on her journey through London. This feeds into our Geography lessons where the children are learning about the city of London. We have had our very own virtual experience of the London tubes by watching a video of a moving tube, sitting as if we were in the tube. In our science lesson we are looking at garden plants drawing and naming the parts of the plant and what plants need to grow.

#### Year 2

This week in Maple class we have been looking at narratives. We have been talking about the structure of our working text: 'Gorilla' looking at key words and the events within the book. We had lots of fun on World Book Day as well exploring Beatrix Potter stories and learning about the author herself.

In Maths we have been using the 5 and 10 timetable to calculate different problems and have spotted patterns that link these times tables together. In science we learnt about the life cycle of a plant and created life cycle wheels. In PSHRE we learnt about medicines and how they keep us healthy. We discussed how we must take medicines responsibly and were able to link this with our school rules.

Please be reminded next week is our Express event on Monday 11th March at 9am until 10am. We will be exploring science week!

#### Year 3:

Next week, in Literacy, we are continuing on with our speech writing, firstly by completing a shared write, then a paired write and then finally an independent write. In maths, we are carrying on with our fraction work and will be ordering and comparing fractions. In Science we are going to explore how water is transported through plants by conducting an experiment with celery and dye. In Geography, we are going to create comic book strips explaining how volcanoes are formed.

Please note that Year 3 Express Event is next Tuesday (12th March) at 9am.

#### Year 4:

Next week is Science Week during which time Ash Class will be carrying out investigations and experiments related to teeth. Literacy will focus on writing a diary entry from the point of view of Wilbur from Charlotte's Web. Maths will link our work on angles to different triangles. In Geography, we shall be comparing the climate of Barcelona to Kemsley.

Finally, a reminder that Year 4 have their Express event on Tuesday  $12^{\text{th}}$  March at 2pm.

#### Year 5:

This week we have been starting newspaper reports and learning about Charles Dickens for World Book Day. In Maths, we have been learning how to read and interpret timetables.

Next week we will be joining in with Science week and enjoying fun experiments, as well as writing our newspaper reports about a boy going overboard! Thank you to the whole of Birch Class for a great first week!

#### Year 6

First of all, the adults in Year 6 would like to praise all the children who took part in Level 1 & Level 2 of bikeability this week. The instructors spoke highly of the engagement and politeness of all the children. Next week group 3 will be taking part in 'Learn to Ride' on Monday and Tuesday. Next week in literacy we will be looking at explanation texts.
