## News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

#### Year N:

This week we have been exploring the story 'This is me', with George from Cbeebies. The story explores how we are all unique! We expressed our uniqueness through dancing and created our own natural loose parts faces. This week we have also been celebrating European languages focussing on France and French! We sang some songs in French and had a French food tasting including croissants, brioche and French cheeses! We were able to discuss which foods we liked and disliked and used our fine motor skills to spread our cheese with a knife. We have been on a 'welly walk' to collect leaves and explore the changes happening in autumn. We then created our own leaf man!

Next week we will be looking at the story 'All kinds of Homes', where we will continue to look at similarities and differences between them. We will be building our homes using junk modelling materials and learning to apply printing to our creative work. We will continue to explore instrumental sounds in phonics and build on our matching skills in maths.

#### Year R

This week within Oak class the children enjoyed another fabulous whole school learning experience, visiting all of the other classrooms to explore elements of different cultures and languages throughout Europe. The children have also been working super hard on their letter to sound recognition, and we could not be more proud of them!

Can we just send a reminder that the children's reading books need to be in school every day. Books will then be changed on designated days according to the children's tribal colours. Please see dojo or ask one of the team if you are not sure which days these are.

#### Year 1:

Another week goes by, and we're still working hard in Willow Class! This week has been full of amazing and brilliant adventures, the key one being European Day of Languages! We all wore such fantastic colours, being fantastic flags! In our Writing next week, we will be beginning our final book for the term, 'The Lion Inside', and we'll be working on crafting a diary entry in the character of Mouse. Our Maths learning next week is all about ordering objects and numbers, and using our number lines to help us out. Thinking about our wider curriculum next week, in Music, we'll continue rehearsing our song 'Hey You!' and showcasing our wonderful voices! Finally, in our RE learning, we'll be exploring the story of 'The Prodigal Son' and its importance.

As a gentle reminder, our PE day is Monday.

#### Year 2

This week in English we have been writing an advert for a holiday in the country or town. We had to come up with a price for our holiday, we had some very good deals with some cheap prices!

In Maths we have continued focusing on place value. We have been working with number lines to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science we have been learning about different bats and we measured how far each one made a rubber ball travel, as we are investigating playground toys and the materials they are made from.

#### <u>Year 3:</u>

Next week, in English, we are going to be thinking about recount writing. In maths we will be exploring adding and subtracting 1-digit from 3-digit numbers. In music, we are going to practice our harvest songs, ready for our harvest festival. In PE we are continuing to practice our throwing and catching skills, focussing on throwing and catching games. In art, we are carrying on our learning about Picasso, creating some interesting cubism-style collages!

Our Express Event is on Friday 13th October.

#### Year 4

It has been fantastic to see so many children bringing in their reading folders every day this week, thank you! In Science, we are going to track changes in state over time through melting and freezing. In our computing lessons, we are working very hard to create our own games, and it is going really well! We will be working on these again this week.

#### Year 5:

Next week in Year 5, we will continue reading *Treason* and will be finishing our independent biographies. We will then begin exploring poetry. In maths we will be learning about inverse operations and how to solve problems and reasoning questions to do with addition and subtraction. In science we will be learning about conductivity. In our history lesson, we will be learning about what life was like in Tudor England.

Please be reminded that our PE day is Tuesday.

#### <u> Year 6:</u>

Firstly, the adults in Year 6 would like to praise the whole class for their excellent behaviour and sensible attitude during European Languages Day. All the children made us proud.

Next week in maths we will be working on division, revisiting our knowledge of the short method of division, using the bus stop method. We will then be moving on to using the long-written method of division, in order to divide two-digit numbers by four-digit numbers. Towards the end of the week, we will be using our division knowledge to solve a range of SATs style reasoning questions.

In literacy, we will be writing an informal letter from the point of view of Bruno from our class text 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'. We will be using all our prior learning to help us first write a class write before moving on to a partner write and finally an independent write. In history we will be researching the Holocaust.
