News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

Year N:

This week the children have been learning all about families, looking at similarities and differences between them. We drew a family portrait and talked about who is in our family. We also worked with clay this week, manipulating and moulding in order to make our own clay face! We used our finger muscles to mould, shape and roll the clay to make the facial features and they are amazing! Well done Cherries! We also created our own obstacle course in the outdoor area incorporating balance, crawling, jumping and hopping!

Next week we will be exploring autumn time with the story 'Leaf Man', looking at the changes happening in the weather. We will also be celebrating uniqueness with the story 'This is me', exploring the language 'same' and 'different'.

Year R

This week, our routine has become slightly more structured with the addition of our phonics and maths adult lead sessions. These sessions are kept relatively short with lots of the children's input. We as a team could not be more impressed with the children's listening and engagement skills.

As part of our topic learning this week, 'All about me', the children shared photos of their families with their new friends. The children took great pride in showing their friends the photos, giving them the confidence to talk to the whole class, naming each of their family members. A huge thank you to all of you that sent in the pictures for your children to take part.

Our Maths learning this week has been all about matching number to quantity and learning about pairs using real life objects. This is a fun and easy activity that you can easily replicate at home with post-it notes and any objects that can be found around the house. Pairing socks is also a good activity to help around the house and show understanding of matching objects. It would seem our little Oaks are loving new learning opportunities and challenges.

Year 1:

What a fantastic week it has been in Willow Class, we've been tackling our learning journeys head on, with a smile on our faces! Next week in our learning, we'll be looking more at Queen Elizabeth II's past in History, as well as continuing to practice our catchy song 'Hey You!' in our Music learning. Furthermore, as we've started a new book 'Hair Love', in English, we'll be working together to craft a character description of our main character, Zuri!

Year 2

This week in English we have been researching how adverts are made so that we can design our own next week. In Maths we have been learning about how to estimate which numbers appear on a number line using the numbers that are already there.

In Science we investigated different bats. We looked at the materials they are made from and described their properties. We will be testing them next week to see which bat hits the ball the furthest! In topic we explored how trade has changed in Sittingbourne.

We have been so impressed with how many children have brought in their homework and reading books this week! Thank you for all your support with this.

Year 3:

Next week in Year 3 we are going to write up our diary entries and we will be exploring addition and subtraction in maths. In art we will begin to practice collage in the style of Picasso. In Science we will be exploring rocks and soil - exploring what makes up different types of soil. In History we are exploring how Stone Age people lived. PE day continues to be a Friday.

Year 4:

Next week in maths we will be starting our addition and subtraction topic. In literacy, we are going to plan and write our newspaper reports. In art we will be completing some potato prints as part of our printing topic. In our topic lessons we will be learning more about Boudicca and re-enacting a Roman battle.

Year 5:

Next week in Year 5, we will continue reading *Treason* and will be writing a biography. We will be adding and subtracting numbers in maths and will be investigating the conductivity of materials in science. In our history lesson, we will be learning about the relationship between England and Rome and the influence of Henry VIII on this. Please be reminded that our PE day is Tuesday.

Year 6:

Firstly, I would like to say a huge well done to all the children for another fantastic week. All the children have been working exceptionally hard and have impressed the adults in Year 6 with their behaviour for learning and excellent listening skills.

Next week the children will be completing some practice SATS papers in arithmetic, reasoning, reading and SPaG. This will help the adults in class assess the progress and attainment the children have already made this term.

In topic we will be learning about evacuation during WWII. We will be learning where children were evacuated to, what they took with them, what host families were like and how long children were evacuated for.

In science we will continue our learning on electricity, working towards creating festive lights for a Christmas tree.

Tuesday 26th September is European Languages Day. All children are invited to come to school dressed in the colours of a European flag. The children will be taking part in a range of different European activities in each different year group throughout the day.
