News from around Kemsley Primary Academy

Year N: This week in Cherry class, we have been focused on the story Owl Babies, learning about owls and creating our own owls using paint and collage materials. We have also been creating owls using playdough and playing with glittery pumpkin soup in the water tray! We have also been learning about Harvest in relation to fruits and vegetables and went on a little walk to collect leaves to make leaf crowns. We have also been continuing our learning around sorting and groups objects with shared features. After half term, we will be exploring the topic 'through my eyes' and continuing to explore the changes in autumn. On Tuesday the 31 st October, we will be celebrating Halloween and encouraging the children to come to school dressed up on this day! We will looking at the story, 'Room on the Broom', and exploring bonfire night towards the end of the week.	Year R What a fantastic first term Oak class have had at Kemsley Primary Academy. It has been wonderful to meet the class and get to know them over the last week. Their fascination and interest in learning is a joy to see. I am looking forward to getting to know the children more after half term. After half term, we will be looking at individuality and what makes us special, this will include a book called, " The Colour of us" by Karen Katz. In maths we will be investigating circles and triangles. We will examine how circles and triangles look and where they appear in the environment.
Year 1: Well done to all the children in Willow Class for a great start to Year 1. All the children have worked extremely hard and demonstrated the school values of resilience and positivity. Next term our topic is 'Home Sweet Home'. In geography, we will be learning all about maps. We will be learning the different points on a compass and using this knowledge to help us read and follow a map in our local area. In literacy our working texts will be 'Beegu', 'Lost and Found' and 'Hansel and Gretel'. We will be using these texts to help us write a persuasive poster, a non-chronological report and a narrative. We will also be listening to our text for pleasure, 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' during story time. Our science topic is 'Building with Materials'. We will be exploring and naming everyday materials and sorting them into groups. We will also be distinguishing between and object and a material and describing their properties.	 Year 2: This week in Maple Class, we have been busy celebrating Black History month and Harvest Festival! We created corn using real popcorn and our handprints. We also wrote sentences describing what we are grateful for. For Black History month we drew portraits of significant people and also learnt about Samuel Crowther who has a link with our local area. In maths, we moved onto a new topic looking at shape. We have counted the sides and vertices on the shapes and next term will move on to looking at symmetry. In English we wrote setting descriptions based on our book: 'Country Mouse, Town Mouse'. In PSHRE, we learnt about the British values and discussed ways we use these in our everyday lives. We also completed our artwork for this term by evaluating our self-portraits. I would like to take this moment to also say a huge thank you to you all for your help this term as parents/carers, from donating things for our express event, to supporting your children to bring in their reading folders and homework folders each day. Please keep ensuring they are brought into school next term. Have a lovely half-term holiday.
Year 3: Wow! What a busy term that was! It has been so lovely getting to know all of your children and I am really looking forward to next term! Next term our new topic is 'Countries, Counties, Cities to See'. We will be focussing on the United Kingdom and how its 'fits' with the rest of the world. In particular, we will be thinking about Kent and its relation to the other counties. In maths, we will be going back to addition and subtraction, practising column addition and subtraction. In Science, we are exploring forces and magnets and will have lots of chances to explore magnetism in the classroom! We all hope you have a lovely, relaxing half term and we look forward to seeing you back on Tuesday 31 st October (Monday 30 th is a staff inset).	Year 4: And so term 1 is complete! We have done some incredible learning in our lessons, and it's been lovely to see you all working so hard. Next term, our topic will be 'Moving Mountains'. We will be reading 'When the Whales Came' by Michael Morpurgo, as our working text and text for pleasure. We will also be starting our times table quizzes next term, beginning with the 2 times table. Have a lovely half-term everyone. Mrs. Fletcher and I look forward to seeing you again soon!
Year 5: Next term in Year 5, we will be writing a non-chronological report, an explanation text, and a narrative. We will be reading 'Journey to the River Sea' by Eva Ibbotson. In maths, we will continue learning multiplication and division and then move onto learning fractions. Our next geography topic will be Rivers and our science topic continues to be Properties of Materials, which will involve more interesting investigations! Have a fantastic week off and we look forward to seeing you on your return.	Year 6: Firstly, I would like to say a huge well done and thank you to all the children in Sycamore Class for an amazing Term 1. All the children have worked exceptionally hard and have been an absolute pleasure to teach. Next term our topic is 'Green Planet'. We will be learning about the six different biomes; rainforests, deserts, savannah, woodlands, grasslands and tundra. We will look at each of these during our geography lessons. In science our topic will be 'Animals including Humans'. We will be learning about the heart and the circulatory system.
