Year N:

This week we have be learning all about birthdays! We read the book 'When is my birthday?' and talked about all of the special things we do when it's a birthday. We have also been practising our cutting skills by cutting out balloons and birthday cakes with candles.

Year R

This week Oak class have made tremendous progress with their phonics learning and are beginning to write words and sentences with greater independence. We have enjoyed learning about kindness on 'Odd Socks Day' and 'Children in Need' on Friday. Next week we will be learning about Divali, the Hindu festival of light. This will be a wonderful opportunity to learn about religions and events and celebrations in different faiths.

Year 1:

This Week in Willow class we have been starting to write our character descriptions on the main character from our book Beegu. We will continue to further develop this next week.

In maths we have been continuing to learn how to subtract using a number line. We have also been consolidating our addition knowledge.

We celebrated anti-bullying and kindness by wearing our odd socks on Monday. This was followed by celebrating Children in need and doing a fun run to raise some money.

Year 2:

This week we learnt about anti-bullying and kindness on odd socks day. We discussed how we are all different and the support available if we are worried about bullying. We also enjoyed celebrating Children in Need on Friday by completing some exercises to raise money for this important cause.

In literacy we have been creating persuasive posters to persuade people to buy a painting from our working text; Flat Stanley. In maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of number, comparing using more than and less than signs.

In geography we have been learning about tourist areas of the UK looking at the weather and landmarks. In science we are continuing our research into materials looking at what is the most appropriate based on its properties to make windows.

Please can we ask that you continue to send your children in with their reading folders each day. Also can you continue to practise with your children at home for our nativity, as we are doing really well, but need to keep going!

Year 3:

Next week we will be completing some assessments in Literacy, Maths, SPAG, Reading and Times Tables. These are nothing to worry about and will just help us to see where your children's understanding is and how we can progress their learning in the coming terms. We will be using our assessments over the week to go through misconceptions. In the afternoons, we will be continuing our learning of computing by using pictures of the school as our backgrounds for Scratch. In music we are going to keep practising our glockenspiels and in Geography we will be continuing our 'Come to Kent' leaflets. PE continues to be a Friday.

Year 4:

Next week we will be completing some assessments in literacy, maths, SPaG, reading and times tables. This will help the adults to understand what we might need to practise a bit more in class and celebrate what we have mastered these past two terms. In Science, we will be looking at what we need to make more complicated circuits. In our topic lessons, we will look at how hills and mountains are represented on maps.

Year 5:

Next week in Year 5, we will be completing assessments in literacy, maths, SPaG, reading and times tables. This is to inform us of any gaps in learning, so nothing to worry about. In our geography lessons, we will be learning about erosion and deposition. In our science lesson, we will be investigating how sugar dissolves in different temperatures. In D&T we will be creating our marble runs, please can you bring in any recycling that would be useful for this (excluding toilet rolls).

Year 6:

Next week is assessment week. All the children in Year 6 will be taking part in practice SATs papers in reading, arithmetic, reasoning and SPaG (spelling, punctuation and grammar).

In science we will be focusing on what makes a healthy diet and other ways we can keep our body healthy. The children will be using their food diaries to present data in a graph. Once we have completed this we will be looking at the effects of different drugs on the body. In topic we will be continuing with our work on biomes. This week we will be researching the grassland biome and putting all the information we find into a double spread page.

Towards the end of the term, as part of our science learning, we will be dissecting pig's hearts. I will need permission for your child to take place, you can do this by commenting on the Class Dojo post or by sending me a private message on Class Dojo. At the end of term, I would also like to show the children the film 'Impossible' which is about the Boxing Day tsunami. The film is rated as a PG, therefore I will need your permission for your child to watch it. Again, you can give permission by commenting on the Class Dojo post.
